## **Presentation Summary**

After hearing Denver residents' concerns for many years about large construction projects and their impact on air quality, the Denver Environmental Quality Division conducted proactive air quality monitoring for PM10, and airborne lead and arsenic (from soils). With several major construction projects happening around the Globeville neighborhood starting in 2017, in addition to CDOT's Central 70 expansion project, the goal was to understand how these major construction projects might impact local air quality.

While localized increases for PM10 did occur near the fenceline, as expected, ensuring compliance with best practices related to materials management and dust suppression kept those increases to a minimum. Airborne lead and arsenic were also well below established health benchmarks.

He has 25+ years of experience working in the Denver Department of Public Health and Environment.
